She highlighted the risks and exposures that all organization's face with regard to unauthorized intrusions and theft on the business systems. She made the participants aware about the impact considerations, risks and mitigation strategies with provisions in the legal framework to combat of cybercrime. She covered intellectual property theft, corporate espionage, legal Cybercrimes

TECHNICAL SESSION - II

The second Technical Session was by Judicial Magistrate Ku. Pratibha Markam. She started with simple definition of Cyber-crime. She introduced Law, copyright Laws, Cyber Law from India and International Perspective. She talked about IT ACT. She explained participants about available Illegal devices, Making, selling, distributing or possessing software for committing a messages with intent to deceive or mislead users of an electronic system, Solicitation of E-records vulnerability and authentication of E-records with some case studies. Her session system interference, Attempts or Produces, sells, procures for use, imports, distributes or makes crime, Identity Fraud - that is using of another person's identity to commit a crime electronically, Forgery of electronic data, the illegal use of unwanted multiple electronic Offences related to using mobile phones to text or send indecent video clips or private video clips etc. She shared her knowledge & experience on "How to be safe with Social Media". She discussed some cases related to social media impacts and also provision of court proceeding included cyber crime offences like accessing electronic systems for dishonest purpose, Illegal children, Child Pornography, Harassment utilizing means of electronic communication, for Cybercrimes.

OBJECTIVE OF THE WORKSHOP

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· She delivered lectures about Child rights and protection of children from sexual offence. She also highlighted various schemes being launched by the Govt. for the

TECHNICAL SESSION - II

- The Second Technical Session was taken by Judicial Magistrate Smt. Shivani Singh. She told that according to available statistics from around the globe, one out of every three women has experienced violence in an intimate relationship at some point in her life. There are several Act that provide effective protection of the rights of women guaranteed under the Constitution who are victims of violence of any kind occurring within the family and formatters connected therewith or incidental thereto.
- One main concern in tribal area is "Macabre practice of Witch-hunting" Witchhunting is essentially a legacy of violence against women in our society. For almost invariably, it is women, especially Dalit or Adivasi widow women, who are branded as Dayan's or Witches by relatives, villagers who have an eye over their houses or land. Nearly 200 to 150 women are killed every year in India after being tagged as 'witches'. There are several rights and protection from this offence.

TECHNICAL SESSION - I

• The first Technical Session was taken by Judicial Magistrate Ku. Pratibha Markam. She told that the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous People (UNDRIP), was adopted in 2007, for which India voted, recognises among other things indigenous peoples' rights to self-determination, autonomy or self-governance, and their right against forcible displacement and relocation from their lands or territories without free, prior and informed consent. Indigenous and Tribal Peoples, 1989 which is based on the "respect for the cultures and ways of life of indigenous peoples" and recognises their "right to land and natural resources and to define their own priorities for development." India is not a party to this, but it is a party to the ILO Convention concerning the Protection and Integration of Indigenous and Other Tribal and Semi-Tribal Populations in Independent Countries, 1957 which is outdated and closed for ratification.
