OBJECTIVE OF THE WORKSHOP

Certain habits like washing hands before meals, bathing, brushing teeth and cutting nails should be practiced from early age. These are considered as personal habits. She explained that good personal hygiene is as simple as hand washing which can reduce the plethora of illnesses, infections, and disorders. Different pictures were used to make the presentation more vital and appealing.

 communities.

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
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
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One Day Workshop on PERSONALITY DEVELOPENT entitled "IGNITING MIND"



Madam speaker enlightened the participants about 10 keystones of communication skills:

1. Listening - Being a good listener is one of the best ways to be a good communicator.

Take the time to practice active listening.

2. Non-verbal Communication - Your body language, eye contact, hand gestures, and tone of

voice all say a lot about the message you are trying to convey. Eye contact is also important; you have to look the persons in eye to demonstrate that you are focused on them and the

conversation. Also, pay attention to other people's nonverbal signals while you are talking.

3. Clarity and Conciseness - Good verbal communication means saying just enough - don't

talk too much or too little. Try to convey your message in as few words as possible.

4. Friendliness - It's important to be polite in communications. This is important in both face-to-face and written communication.

5. Confidence - It is important to be confident in your interactions with others. Confidence

shows that you believe in what you're saying and will follow through


6. Empathy - Using phrases as simple as "I understand where you are coming from" demonstrate that you have been listening to the other person and respect their opinions.

7. Open-Mindedness - A good communicator should enter into any conversation with a flexible, open mind.
8. Respect- People will be more open to communicate with you if you convey respect for them.



Government College Gharghoda and & Civil Court, Gharghoda jointly organized a one-day awareness program on "Child Labour, Child Abuse, Rights of women and their protection from Domestic Violence" for Professors and Students. The workshop was held at Seminar Hall, Government College Gharghoda, Dist. Raigarh on 28th January, 2019.

The Resource Persons for the workshop were:

- 2) Judicial Magistrate Ku. Pratibha Markam

Under the guidance of Additional District Judge, Ashish Pathak, a legal awareness workshop was organized by Government College Gharghoda, Dist. Raigarh. The theme entitled "Child Labour, Child Abuse, Rights of women and their protection from Domestic Violence".

OBJECTIVE of THE WORKSHOP:

The main objective of the programme was to make the students aware about child rights, child abuse and various issues related to women and steps provided in law for overcoming the same. The main reason for conducting such programs is that Legal education helps in changing the attitude of public and make them connect to the social problems; it makes people more aware about their rights and duties and help them to become ideal citizens.

IQAC Coordinator Ms. Renu Kujur, formally welcomed all the dignitaries present on the dais and participants. She mentioned about the importance of awareness activities in order to make people aware of their rights and about the role, activities and functioning of the legal services. She then invited the eminent speakers Judicial Magistrate Smt. Shivani Singh and Judicial Magistrate Ku. Pratibha Markam to lead the session.

TECHNICAL SESSIONS FROM KEYNOTE SPEAKERS:

TECHNICAL SESSION – I

- The first Technical Session was taken by Judicial Magistrate Ku. Pratibha Markam. She
 started with simple definition of child labour and child abuse. Child labour has been the
 most important concern in the world because it affects the children both mentally and
 physically. It also destroys their future.
- She spoke about child abuse which is a ubiquitous problem with personal, interpersonal, and social consequences. Risk factors are well established, and preventive strategies have been effective in decreasing abusive parenting behaviours and child maltreatment incident reports.

She delivered lectures about Child rights and protection of children from sexual offence. She also highlighted various schemes being launched by the Govt. for the benefit of Child and women rights.

TECHNICAL SESSION - II

- The Second Technical Session was taken by Judicial Magistrate Smt. Shivani Singh. She told that according to available statistics from around the globe, one out of every three women has experienced violence in an intimate relationship at some point in her life. There are several Act that provide effective protection of the rights of women guaranteed under the Constitution who are victims of violence of any kind occurring
- within the family and formatters connected therewith or incidental thereto. One main concern in tribal area is "Macabre practice of Witch-hunting" - Witchhunting is essentially a legacy of violence against women in our society. For almost invariably, it is women, especially Dalit or Adivasi widow women, who are branded as

Dayan's or Witches by relatives, villagers who have an eye over their houses or land. Nearly 200 to 150 women are killed every year in India after being tagged as 'witches'. There are several rights and protection from this offence. Dr. Y. K. Chandra delivered vote of thanks and requested the organizers to hold more such enlightening programs in near future. 01.
